# PEANUT and NUT SAFE SCHOOL

# FRAGRANCE FREE SCHOOL

Woodland Park is also a fragrance free school. Students, staff, and volunteers are asked <u>not to wear</u> perfumed products to school.

## **ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION TO STUDENTS**

In situations where a physician deems it necessary that prescribed drugs be administered to a student at school, the Board's approved medication form must be completed and signed by the parent/guardian. (A copy of this form is available at the office and on our website.) Prescribed inhalators should be handled in the same manner. Please note – school personnel do not handle non-prescription medication.



# Children requiring emergency Epi-pen injections:

School personnel will administer Epi-pen injections as an emergency response to allergic reactions when the necessary, signed forms are provided. These forms have been sent home with applicable students. If your child(ren) requires an epi-pen and you did not receive these forms, please contact the office.

## **STUDENT SAFETY**

Students are reminded to walk to and from school with a friend/adult, not to talk to strangers and not to approach a vehicle that they do not know. Please review these important safety measures with your child.

These are <u>not</u> permitted on the school grounds during school hours. Students are **not** to bring them to school since there is no available secure storage for these articles.

## **BICYCLES TO SCHOOL**

Parents are encouraged to review bicycle safety with their children. All students are expected to obey bicycle safety rules and wear an approved bicycle helmet. Students must walk their bicycles when arriving and leaving school property. Storage racks are provided for bicycles but the school cannot assume responsibility for loss or damage. Students must lock their bicycles securely when leaving them in the bike rack. At the end of the school day, students should be going directly home.

## APPROPRIATE DRESS FOR SCHOOL

Students are reminded that school is similar to a place of work and that their dress is to reflect that tone.

NO caps or other headgear worn in the school other than for religious reasons.

NO short shorts.

NO halter tops, muscle shirts and thin-strapped or low-cut tank tops. Shirts must be long enough to cover the stomach. NO bare midriffs.

It is expected that children will wear clothing such that they are covered from shoulders to mid-thigh (or as measured by a full extension of fingers, hands and arms along the seam reaching the hem of the short or skirt).

NO shirts with obscenities, racial comments, obscene pictures, alcohol, drug or tobacco-related products.

The dress code applies to students of all ages from kindergarten to grade eight.

If a student comes to school with inappropriate dress, he/she will be asked to change into gym clothes or to make a call to parents to arrange for a change of clothes. Parents are asked to help their students make good choices for suitable clothing using the guidelines outlined in the student planner.
